Roby Sanger, a member of our congregation for many years, was detained by immigration authorities on Jan. 25, 2018 after dropping his daughter off at school. He has been held at Essex County Detention and not seen his wife Conny for ten months.

Today, I am happy to report that Roby has been released on bail and reunited with his family! Roby will remain with his family until the court system determines his future status in the US.

Since January, we have been doing everything possible in order to assist Roby and his family during this difficult time. We will continue to assist him and hope and pray that he will be granted asylum and remain with his family in the US.

There are too many people to thank, but none of this would be possible without the law firms of Paul Weiss and Sidley Austin as well as the support of the ACLU. I also want to thank our church staff and the Immigration Task Force for their constant vigilance and care for Roby and his family. A final thank you to the PC(USA) immigration team, our local politicians, and Seth Kaper-Dale at the Reformed Church of Highland Park.

Please keep Roby and his family in your prayers. We will be celebrating and praising God with the Sangers this upcoming Sunday as the Rev. Dr. Fred Garry leads us in worship.
